Work and Holiday Visa (Subclass 462) - Checklist

The Work and Holiday visa provides a unique, once in a lifetime opportunity for Singaporeans between the ages of 18 and 30 to experience a working holiday in Australia. There is an annual limit of 500 places per year.

All applicants must make an appointment through an online booking system at www.vfsglobal.com/australia/singapore and then personally attend the Australian Visa Application Centre (AVAC) in Singapore to submit their application and supporting documents. Applicants will need to enter their NRIC or passport number to make an appointment. You must have an appointment to submit your application.

Your passport is required as proof of identity when you submit your application.

Please use this checklist to ensure that you have the main documents we require to assess your application. While we may ask you to provide additional documents during the processing of your application, a decision on your visa application may be made solely on the information and documentation that you provide at the time of lodgement.

Important:

- Please provide an email address on the application form as this is the easiest way to communicate with you.
- Please do not include any original documents with your application.

You should prepare a **complete and well-documented application** to assist the visa decision maker to reach a clear and favourable decision. If there is information that you are not able to provide, you should include a letter stating why and those reasons will be taken into account. Incomplete or poorly documented applications may be delayed or may be unsuccessful.

Any foreign language documents must be accompanied by official translations into English (please refer to the Yellow Pages for translators).

NOTE – YOU SHOULD TICK THE BOXES TO INDICATE WHAT YOU HAVE INCLUDED WITH YOUR APPLICATION, SIGN AT THE END, AND SUBMIT THIS COMPLETED CHECKLIST WITH YOUR APPLICATION

MANDATORY FOR ALL APPLICANTS

Fully completed and signed application (Form 1208) and application fee . If you have paid online through ImmiAccount, include a copy of the receipt.
Your current original passport and provide a copy of the identity page of your passport
One passport-sized photograph (see photo specifications on AVAC website)
A copy of your Birth Certificate and NRIC
Evidence of your name change (if any)

A copy of your marriage certificate or divorce certificate (if any)
Evidence of military service record or discharge papers (if any)
Provide evidence that you have or have access to sufficient funds for personal support during your 12 month stay in Australia of at least AUD 5,000. This could include:
 Copies of your bank statements or deposit books showing your savings history for the last three months; and Copies of your payslips for the last three months (if any); If your parents are providing funds for your stay in Australia, copies of their bank statements or deposit books showing their saving history for the last three months, plus a signed letter of support from the parent and copies of their passport identity/signature pages.
Provide evidence that you hold an onward travel ticket out of Australia, or have access to sufficient funds to cover travel costs to and from Australia. Note: This must be in addition to your funds for personal support while in Australia.
Provide evidence of tertiary qualifications or evidence of having successfully completed at least two years of tertiary study. You must provide: • A copy of your graduation certificate from a tertiary institution; and • A copy of your academic transcripts from a tertiary institution; • If your graduation certificate is awarded by an overseas tertiary institution but you have undertaken the course in a local campus in Singapore, evidence to support that.
Provide evidence that you have a level of English which is assessed as at least functional. Please note that evidence of high school matriculation in Singapore satisfies this requirement.

If you do not have evidence of high school matriculation in Singapore, you may need to provide further evidence of functional English. This can include a certificate from a specified English language test showing that you meet the English language skill requirement such as IELTS, TOEFL, OET, PTE Academic, or Cambridge Advanced English. Health Requirements

Character Requirements

Signed (visa applicant)

You may be required to provide a penal clearance for any country you have lived in for 12 months, or longer, in the last ten years, since reaching 16 years of age. The office processing your application will advise you if they require these documents
