Parking is strictly not allowed at the Australian High Commission and the closest car park facilities are located at Gleneagles Hospital, Botanical Gardens or Tanglin Mall. You are strongly encouraged to park your car at the suggested spots or take public transport.

No filming or photography is allowed at the Australian High Commission.
